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
"... a Police National Computer (PNC) check was conducted on all who died at Hillsborough for whom a blood alcohol reading above zero was recorded. It includes a handwritten list of the names, dates of birth, blood alcohol readings and home addresses of 51 of the deceased and provides screen-prints apparently drawn from the PNC. A summary of the results appears on the front page, establishing the number 'with cons' (convictions)."

Auto-Icon - "a man who is his own image"

Extract from Bentham's will:

"My body I give to my dear friend Doctor Southwood Smith The skeleton he will cause to be put together in such a manner as that the whole figure may be seated in a chair usually occupied by me when living, in the attitude in which I am sitting when engaged in thought in the course of time employed in writing. ... to be clad in one of the suits of black occasionally worn by me ... and for containing the whole apparatus he will cause to be prepared an appropriate box or case. If it should so happen that my personal friends and other disciples should be disposed to meet together ... my executor will ... cause to be conveyed to the room in which they meet the said box or case"



Remembrance and memory are not fixed


- "Public opinion changes: public opinion is enlightened by experience, by knowledge, by philosophy. ... prejudices of our age pass ...
